

Pupil Premium Report 2016 - 17

Over the past year we have used the Pupil Premium and Service Premium funding in a variety of ways to make sure that eligible children receive every opportunity to be successful. This includes greater levels of welfare care, additional 1:1 tuition targeting those children from identified groups, enhanced in-class support and further interventions to support learning. The academies endeavour to get the best value for money from the funding they have received.

The main barriers to achievement faced by children in receipt of funding in our academies are:

- Low attainment on entry in to Reception
- Delayed speech and language
- Lack of family stability and parental engagement in education
- Poor housing conditions
- Children acting as young carers
- Chronic medical conditions
- Child and family mental health issues
